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Supplement Narrative

On March 08-2016 at approximately 11:28 pm the North Manchester Police Dept took a 911 call transferred by the Wabash Central dispatch. The caller, Mikayla Paige, Munn, age 21, informed dispatchers that she had given birth in her bathtub, and had fainted after giving birth. She stated that there was blood everywhere and she was naked, and sorry for that. Both times she responded to the two dispatchers, she stated she had given birth and then passed out.

Manchester University Safety Officers were the first units on scene. Manchester University use body cameras for all calls they respond to. I have copies of the videos of University Officers making entry into Ms. Munn's dorm room. Ms. Munn was at Oakwood Hall, room 316, in North Manchester, IN. On the video, Ms. Munn states, " Apparently I was pregnant and I hit my head, I didn't know I was pregnant, and I have blood everywhere. I tied the umbilical cord with a shoe lace that I could find". In the video, you can see that Ms. Munn is holding the baby in her arm, wrapped in a towel, and she has her cell phone also. You can see blood on the side of the tub and in the water. On the floor next to the tub, you can see a single shoe with no shoe string. Ms. Munn continues to say she took Ibuprofen, Midal, and cold medicine, because she thought it was just cramping, but apparently its not. She then states that "I fainted and I have no idea what's going on, but I'm fine". Safety Officers say I'm sure you were in shock, and she responds yes I was not prepared for this at all and then laughs. She then states she got a towel and wrapped the baby. The Safety Officer asks about the the baby and she states, " Well the last time I checked it wasn't breathing". Ms. Munn stated she tried to get up and started bleeding so that's how the blood got everywhere, so she set back down in the tub and turned the drain on. She then says " My mom will be so pissed when she hears about this, but there was nothing I could do about it, I didn't know I was pregnant". And she laughs again. Ms. Munn then says yeah he is cold, and the Safety Officer says well I'm sorry. Ms. Munn stated "Well in retrospect I didn't know either". Sgt. Greg Tomlinson arrives at the scene and when he enters the room and sees everything, he says OH and turns around to wait outside for EMS. Ms. Munn then laughing says well at least I got to the bathroom.

Ms. Munn did state to First Responder Alycee Kissinger that she had strong cramping and thought it was just bloating for her period. She again stated she didn't know she was pregnant. She says she passed out and when asked, "when you came to", Ms. Munn states, " It came out and that's the only thing remember, then I woke up and the blood." Mrs. Kissenger asked was the baby in the water? Ms. Munn stated yes and I have a shoe lace around the umbilical cord too, because it said something about clamping. The umbilical cord had been tied off with the shoe lace.

When Paramedics Jeff Bennett and Andrew Metzger arrived Ms. Munn apologized and Mr. Bennett asked why she was apologizing. Mr. Bennett asked if that was still attached and up inside of Ms. Munn, referring to the umbilical cord. Ms. Munn states it was and then said that she tied it off with a shoe lace because she "read that somewhere". Ms. Munn was holding the baby in a towel in the beginning of the video. After Paramedics arrived she had a fainting spell and it's not clear at what point, but she drop's the baby back into the water. Ms. Munn never tries to pick the child up from that point on. When

the Paramedic Jeff Bennett comes back in, he clamps off the umbilical cord and cuts it, because he believed it was still attached and inside Ms. Munn. After doing this, he pulls the baby out of the water and places the baby in a new towel which Ms. Kissinger gets from the closet area. The baby was FLOATING face down in the water away from the original towel it was in. I later asked Mr. Bennett about the towel and he stated he didn't remember any other towel, but the one he put the baby in. Mr. Bennett stated that he couldn't see well in the water with the blood and Ms. Munn still sitting in the tub. I later asked Mr. Metzger about Ms. Munn fainting and he stated that he didn't feel she did faint, because when he came in she was never actual out because she was alert and was able to talk. Mr. Metzger stated that wasn't right for someone to come to so quickly if they had fainted. Ms. Munn and the baby were transported to the Kosciusko County Hospitals OB ward. While on transport, Ms. Munn did state that she had looked up pregnancy related things on her phone, but she didn't think they related to her.

I did obtain a search warrant for Ms. Munn's cell phone and her lap top, I Pad and any other electronic devices. After these items were obtained I received another search warrant to have these items searched for any correspondence or electronic texts that they may have contained. State Police Officer Jason Page and myself were present during the autopsy of the baby and photos were taken through out the process. Officer Page and myself also arrived at KCH to talk with Ms. Munn within the first 24 hours of this all occurring. Ms. Munn was read her Miranda warnings at that time and was aware she did not have to talk with us. Ms. Munn did sign a waiver stating she would talk with us at that time. When we spoke to Ms. Munn, she also had her sister present in the room for the entire time. I did try to record this entire interview with my body camera but it was later found to have malfunctioned and nothing was recorded. Officer Page did record audio with his phone during this interview. Ms. Munn had stated that she had no idea she was pregnant and she even stated that she had taken two separate pregnancy test which came out negative. She stated she still had a spotty period and that she struggled with her weight but she did not know she was pregnant.

She stated that she had passed out after seeing a bubble coming from her vagina, and when she saw the baby's head. She passed out and when she came to she remembered seeing all the blood then the baby in the water. Ms. Munn stated that she had poked at the baby while it was in the water. When asked why she didn't try to do CPR she stated she had never been trained in that. Ms. Munn is going to school to be physical education teacher, and she was currently helping teach small children from kindergarten to elementary school. Ms. Munn had stated she had done a CPR class as required but only for adults never for small children. Ms. Munn had stated that the baby was blue and cold to the touch during the interview. Ms. Munn stated that when she came to, she remember the baby on the bottom of the tub, completely submerged under water. Officer Page asked if the baby had any portion sticking gout of the water like his ear, his elbow or any part of him. Mr. Page had asked if the baby was on the bottom of the tub or floating in the middle of the water. Ms. Munn had stated the baby was on the bottom of the tub completely under water. Ms. Munn remembered tying the umbilical with the shoelace but told us she remembered it from a TV show or something. Ms. Munn could not explain how the shoe got into the bathroom. Just that it was there and she pulled the shoelace from it. The

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other matching show was located in the front room, next to the front door along with all of Ms. Munn's shoes.

Ms. Munn had also been talked to by the Wabash County Coroner. This interview was also recorded on video. Ms. Munn had again stated she was unaware she was pregnant. Ms. Munn had stated on several occasions to several people she had no idea she was ever pregnant. Upon investigating the death of the baby it was determined that Ms. Munn had several text messages, earlier in the pregnancy, that she was aware of being pregnant and on Oct 12, 2015 she text a Mr. Desmond D Roland about being pregnant and even being 4 months along back at that time. Ms. Munn had looked up or goggled several things about pregnancy during the entire 9 months. Ms. Munn had also texted a Mr. Landen Hughes stating he was the father, and that she should go to the clinic to have an abortion. This conversation was in February of 2016, just weeks before giving birth in her dorm room. Ms. Munn states she was at a hospital and was taking care of it. She texted that they had given her something to insert in her stuff to end the pregnancy. Ms. Munn had stated during our interview that she had been told of a website about at home abortions. Ms. Munn stated she was curious about it and she had looked it up on her phone. Ms. Munn had looked up several ways to have an abortion at home safely and some things included large amounts of aspirin, and vitamin C. Ms. Munn had a 1000 count bottle of Ibuprofen in her dormroom bathroom.

State Police Det Joshua Maller also helped conduct interviews and investigate this case. Officer Maller had spoken to a Dr. Timothy F. Cook, of KCH OBGYN. After talking with Dr. Cook, it can be determined that Ms. Munn story of the baby being submerged in the water, on the bottom of the tub, was false. Dr. Cook stated that a newborn child could not have sank to the bottom of the tub, it would have been FLOATING on the surface. This is just as Paramedic Jeff Bennett described as he pulled the deceased baby from the water. Ms. Munn stating that she had passed out while delivering the child is HIGHLY unlikely because if she had lost consciousness for the entire delivery process, her body would have gone limp and she should have slid down under the water herself. She had stated that the after birth or placenta was still attached and inside of her, this was not so. It was pulled from the bathtub by the Wabash County Coroner. Dr. Cook advised that the afterbirth or placenta would have taken another 10 minutes or more to deliver after the child was born. Ms. Munn stated she was unconscious until after the child had came out and that she then came to and POKED at the baby. At no point did Ms. Munn try to render aid to the child, by her own actions or by immediately calling 911. It can be shown that Ms. Munn was looking things up on her phone after the child was delivered and there was a 19 minute wait before calling 911. Ms. Munn cannot ever explain why the shoe was in the bathroom with her. The shoe has no blood on it whatsoever. Which is also a problem as she had stated she woke up after giving birth and then pulling the shoelace. The lack of blood indicates she brought the shoe into the bathroom with her prior to getting into the tub. This also shows she had to have removed the shoelace before delivering the baby. Ms. Munn has numerous inconsistencies in her story and out right lies after investigating this incident. It is believed by Ms. Munn's own actions and texts show that she was aware of her pregnancy. She attempted to take steps to try and stop her

pregnancy and she tried to hide this from police. Ms. Munn's own actions of never showing any kind of feelings or emotions drew several of the first responders and Paramedics as completely wrong .

Dr. Sozio is a Forensic Pathologist who conducted the autopsy of the deceased child. While conducting the autopsy, which I attended, it was found the child was a full term, healthy baby, with no abnormalities. It was shown that the child had liquid in its stomach, and that one lung was filled with air. These indicate the child was born alive and had taken a breath. The autopsy was concluded as DEATH DUE TO Asphyxia DUE TO DROWNING, and MANNER OF DEATH AS Homicide. All these events took place in North Manchester.

On 3-8-2016 around 2329 hours I was on patrol in North Manchester when I was told by dispatch the Lifemed EMS was being dispatched to Oakwood Hall, room 316 at Manchester University for a resident that had a still born birth. Upon my arrival I saw Sergeant Greg TOMLINSON already in room 316 so I waited out in the hall so that Lifemed and first responders had room to get to the female, identified as Ms. Mikayla MUNN. As Lifemed was working with Ms. MUNN Sergeant TOMLINSON had me start taking pictures. I took pictures of the bathroom and Ms. MUNN in the bathtub the best I could. Once Lifemed took Ms. MUNN to the ambulance to be transported to Kosciusko Community Hospital (KCH) I continued taking pictures of the room and bathtub. While taking pictures Sergeant TOMLINSON told me that there was what appeared to be a shoe string in the bathtub.

While taking pictures of the string Sergeant TOMLINSON told me there was a shoe next to the toilet that was missing a shoe string. I took pictures of the shoe. When I exited the bathroom I noticed by the entrance door that the matching shoe to the one in the bathroom was next to the door. I took pictures of the matching shoe and shoe string. After finishing taking pictures I was waiting in room 316 and Wabash County Coroner Ms. Carol WHITESELL arrived. Ms. WHITESELL told Sergeant TOMLINSON that the placenta was in the bathtub. Ms. WHITESELL picked the placenta up out of the bath room and the shoe string was tied around the umbilical cord. Sergeant TOMLINSON took a picture of the shoe string tied on the umbilical cord.

I left Oakwood Hall and went to KCH, once at KCH I spoke to a Ms. Corrie STOKES who is an RN at KCH. Ms. STOKES told me she was the nurse giving care to Ms. MUNN, Ms. STOKES told me that Ms. MUNN said that she had used her phone to look up information about labor and giving birth. Ms. WHITESELL arrived and we went to the room where Ms. MUNN was so Ms. WHITESELL could speak with Ms. MUNN. I stayed in the room while Ms. WHITESELL talked with Ms. MUNN, Ms. MUNN said that she did not know she was pregnant. Ms. MUNN told Ms. WHITESELL that she was in the bath tub to sit in hot water to help with the cramps she was feeling. Ms. MUNN said that she refilled the bathtub 2 or 3 times to keep the water warm. Ms. MUNN said that she did not know when the shoe got into the bathroom but she had seen on TV that she needed to tie the shoe string around the umbilical cord.

After speaking with Ms. MUNN I went with Ms. WHITESELL into the nursery where the deceased baby boy was and Ms. WHITESELL took pictures of the baby. I left the hospital and returned to North Manchester Police Department. Ms. WHITESELL arrived at North Manchester Police Department and told me that one of the nurses told her that Ms. MUNN said she was using her phone to look up information about water births. Ms. MUNN's phone was left in the bathroom on the bathroom sink in room 316 at Oakwood Hall.


Supplement Narrative

On Tuesday night March 8th, 2016, at about 11:42PM I was called at home by Sgt. Greg Tomlinson. Sgt. Tomlinson told me that he was at Manchester University, Oakwood Hall room 316. They had received a call of a female student that had given birth to a baby in the bathtub and that the baby was deceased. I advised Sgt. Tomlinson that I would come up and that he should contact the Coroner to find out how she wanted to handle the death. When I arrived at the scene, Life Med ambulance service was just taking the female out of the dorm on a stretcher, I saw that Paramedic Jeff Bennett was carrying the baby and that it was wrapped in a towel. As I arrived at room 316, I noted that the room was for a residence assistant, and I learned that her name was Mikayla. I later found out that her last name was Munn. Oakwood Hall has suites that normally have 4 people in 2 rooms and a central bathroom. Since this room was for a residence assistant the room is a single occupancy, with a bathroom. I asked if photos had been taken yet and was told that they had been I checked what had been taken and asked that a couple more be taken. While Sgt. Tomlinson was showing me the bathroom we saw that there was what appeared to be a shoe string and what appeared to be the placenta in the water. There was also a towel in the water. Sgt. Tomlinson called the Coroner and explained that we both thought that the Placenta was in the bathtub yet. She decided that she would come up to the scene.

Once Ms. Whitesel arrived she took control of the Placenta and the Shoestring that had been in the bathtub. She then stated that she was going to go to Kosciusko County hospital, to talk with Ms. Munn and that she wanted an officer to accompany her. I advised Officer Isaac Adams to go along. I told them that we would need to do a taped statement when Ms. Munn got out of the hospital, and to ask her to set an appointment once she was released.

Once Ms. Whitesel left the scene, I turned it back over to campus security and left the scene.

On March 8, 2016 at approximately 11:29 p.m. I was told by dispatch that Lifemed was en route to Oakwood Hall room 316 at Manchester University for a resident that just had a still born birth. Upon arrival I saw college security officers already in the room. I went to the bathroom where a female, later identified as Mikayla Munn, sitting in the bathtub holding a baby. The baby was not breathing or moving. The bathtub had approximately 6 inches of water in it and it was stained blood red.

A short while later Lifemed arrived and began asking questions about what had happened. Ms. Munn was asked if she could remember what happened. Ms. Munn stated that she wasn't feeling well and thought that maybe she was having her period so she went to the bathroom. She stated that she was in the bathtub and must have passed out because when she woke up she saw all the blood and realized that she had a baby in the tub. Ms. Munn said that she didn't even know that she was pregnant and that the baby was already dead when she woke up.

I called and spoke with Chief Jeff Perry and advised him of what was going on. He stated to call the coroner and that he would be en route to our location. Officers Isaac Adams and Joshua Brainard arrived and I met them in the hallway to the dorm room. I asked them to get a camera for pictures.

I then called and spoke with Coroner Carol Whitsell and told her what I had and that Lifemed believed that the placenta was still attached to Ms. Munn. I was told by Lifemed that they would be taking Ms. Munn to Kosciusko County Hospital. Ms. Whitsell stated that she was on her way to our location. Lifemed took Ms. Munn and the deceased baby boy to the hospital.


I had officer Adams take pictures of the entire dorm room. While in the bathroom I noticed a shoe string in the bathtub. Pictures were also taken of it. I then saw that there was a shoe by the toilet that was missing a shoe string. Pictures were taken of this also. I then bagged this shoe for evidence. The match to this shoe was located in the hallway area of the dorm. This was the matching shoe to the one in the bathroom but this one had the shoe string still attached. Pictures were taken of this also.

I called and spoke to the hospital nurse in the ER and had them keep the baby in a safe place and any other evidence until we could make the scene. She advised that she would.

A short time later, the coroner arrived and stated that the placenta was in the bathtub and that the shoe string was tied around the umbilical cord. The placenta and shoe string was taken by Ms. Whitsell and bagged into an evidence bag. Ms. Whitsell stated that she was going to go to the hospital and retrieve the deceased child for an autopsy at Parkview Wabash Hospital.

Once back on station I placed the shoe that I took from the bathroom, labeled as item #1, and placed it into the property locker.

I, Det. Joshua Maller, PE 8136, of the Indiana State Police Department being first duly sworn upon oath, says that on the 8th day of March, 2016 at 11:28 p.m. in the County of Wabash and in the State of Indiana and at

604 E College Ave, North Manchester, IN 46962 (Manchester University – Oakwood 316)

location, the following offense occurred:

On March 8, 2016, at approximately 11:28 p.m. a 911 call was received by Wabash County Central Dispatch. The caller, MIKAYLA PAIGE MUNN, age 21, informed the 911 operator that she just gave birth in her bathroom and “fainted” after she gave birth. The call was then transferred to the North Manchester Dispatch in which Mikayla again informed her name, location, and that she “just gave birth and passed out” and that the baby is not breathing. Mikayla also informs dispatch that she is naked and apologizes for it. The call was ended shortly after. It should be noted that during this call Mikayla sounds very calm.

Shortly after the 911 call Manchester University Safety Officers arrived and made entry into her dorm room ‘Oakwood 316’. The entry is captured on body cameras worn by the two responding safety officers. As the safety officers enter the room and announce their presence, Mikayla can be heard from the bathroom stating “I’m here, I’m naked by the way, I’m sorry.” When the safety officers asked what’s going on, Mikayla responds “apparently I was pregnant and I hit my head, I didn’t know I was pregnant and I have blood everywhere and the baby’s not breathing, I tied the umbilical cord with my shoelace that I could find and I took Ibuprofen, I took Midol, and I took cold medicine because I thought it was just cramping and apparently it’s not.” The safety officers then enter the room and locate Mikayla in her bathroom, sitting in bloody water in her tub. She was holding a towel wrapped baby in her arms and reports that it is not breathing. During this time Mikayla sounds very calm, even laughing while speaking to the safety officers.

Moments after the Safety Officers arrived; LifeMed EMS Paramedics Jeffrey Bennett (Jeff) and Andrew Metzger arrived at the dorm along with additional first responders. Jeff and Andrew assist Mikayla onto a gurney followed by the newborn’s body. Both were transported to Kosciusko Community Hospital located at 2101 Dubois Dr, Warsaw, IN 46580. Mikayla and the newborn’s body are separated at this time while Mikayla is treated for injuries sustained during the delivery. The newborn is later released to Wabash County Coroner Carol Whitesell and an autopsy is scheduled for later that day (March 9th).

Following the aforementioned incident an investigation ensued. North Manchester Police Department Detective Sergeant Jon Pace was contacted the following morning who in turn contacted Indiana State Police Crime Scene Investigator, Sergeant Jason Page. Together they obtained a search warrant for the dorm room. This search warrant was executed on March 9, 2016, and the room was processed for evidence. At this time a shoe is recovered from the bathroom. This shoe is missing a shoelace which was used to tie off the umbilical cord. During close inspection of this shoe it appears to be free of blood. Mikayla’s phone, tablet, and a laptop are also collected at this time. A secondary search warrant was obtained to further examine the digital contents of the devices.

Electronic devices recovered from the above search warrant yielded the following additional information. Towards the end of May to early June 2015, Mikayla Munn discovered she might be pregnant, as is evident through a text message she sent to DESMOND DENZEL ROLAND, the person she believed to be the father, on October 12, 2015. This text message is observed in an exchange of several messages between Mikayla and Desmond in which she is informing him how she went to the doctor and learned she had been pregnant. She informs Desmond that she was 4 months pregnant but had a miscarriage. She also states that the sex was determined to be a boy. This indicates some form of test was done to determine this. (i.e. a blood test, or ultrasound). Mikayla states that her being pregnant also explains why she was getting sick easily and not bleeding at all during periods. It should be noted that we later learned that Mikayla and Desmond's relationship ended around the time of this conversation. (Indicated by Desmond)

On February 7, 2016, Mikayla begins searching the internet for answers to her questions about being pregnant. These searches, both through Google, included "No stomach movement after pain pills pregnancy" and "Peeing hurts during pregnancy."

On March 31, 2016, Sgt. Pace and I met with LANDEN MARK HUGHES for an interview at the North Manchester Police Department. This interview was audio and video recorded. It should be noted that Landen was introduced to this investigation when it was learned that Mikayla placed his name as the father on the death certificate. (Information provided by Wabash County Coroner). During Landen's interview he described how Mikayla, his former girlfriend, told him she was pregnant with his child. He and Mikayla both agreed that she should get an abortion. At this time, Landen indicated he thought Mikayla was at an early stage of pregnancy and he provided her with suggestions about going to a clinic to have an abortion. During the course of this interview, Landen provides access to his cell phone which contains several weeks' worth of conversation. The primary topics of conversation in these texts are about Mikayla being pregnant, the attempted abortion process, and Landen's concern for her well being as she appears to be in and out of a hospital several times for various reasons. A timeline has been produced which shows that between the dates of text messages Mikayla was also conducting internet searches that coincide with her efforts to have a home abortion. It should also be noted that several of the text messages appear to be false. One such message, dated February 11, 2016 (26 days before birth), Mikayla indicates a hospital is currently providing her with medical assistance to have an abortion. At this time Mikayla also indicates to Landen she will know if it worked in 4 weeks.

On March 8, 2016, at 5:42 a.m. Mikayla conducts an internet search for "4 ways to Cut the Umbilical Cord of a Baby" via wikiHow. This indicates an event occurred that tells Mikayla she is going into labor. This search also yields a method to tie off the umbilical cord with a small rope. Mikayla completes this process later with the lace from one of her shoes. It is believed that the shoe lace was removed prior to the childbirth. This conclusion was made with evidence at the scene which includes the shoe was free of blood and that Mikayla most likely took it to the bathroom with her, leaving the other shoe next to the entry door of the dorm room.

A series of internet searches after that indicate Mikayla was having a large amount of pain and was looking for a way to manage it. This may be where Mikayla got the idea of taking a warm bath. At 10:55 p.m. an internet search of "Bubble outside of vagina" was conducted through Google. According to Dr. Timothy F. Cook, this suggests that Mikayla is seeing the amniotic sack presenting in front of the baby's head. He believes the baby would have been born shortly after and estimates it at approximately 11:00 p.m. Mikayla then conducts another internet search of "Tying off the umbilical cord" through Google. Nineteen minutes then pass before Mikayla calls 911.

On April 13, 2016, Det. Jon Pace and I met with Paramedics Jeffrey Bennett (aka: Jeff) and Andrew Metzger. Audio/Video recorded interviews took place at this time at the North Manchester Police Department. During the interview with Jeff, he indicated that upon entry they were greeted by already present security staff and directed into Mikayla's bathroom. Jeff observed Mikayla sitting in the tub with a large amount of blood in the water while the baby was floating face down as Mikayla was passing out. Jeff indicated he suspects Mikayla passing out during this time was an act, as Mikayla responded when he called her name. Jeff stated during his years of experience as an EMT, someone that is actually passing out will not respond. Jeff also indicated her vitals were atypical of someone that would pass out, noting her blood pressure levels. Jeff noted that Mikayla's responses and lack of emotion seemed inappropriate to that of someone who just lost a child. During the interview with Andrew, he reiterated the initial observations made by Jeff as well as indicating he drove the ambulance during this incident.

On April 1, 2016, a conference call took place that included Dr. Thomas J. Sozio (Forensic Pathologist), Dr. Timothy F. Cook (OBGYN), Sgt. Jason Page (CSI), Det. Sgt. Jon Pace and I. Prior to this call a copy of the aforementioned timeline was provided to each. Using this timeline Dr. Cook was able to surmise that Mikayla gave birth between 10:56 p.m. and 11:09 p.m. Dr. Cook indicates that after this time is when Mikayla conducts another internet search for "tying off the umbilical cord" - Google Search. This indicates that Mikayla has delivered the baby and she is still conscious. Dr. Cook provided the same opinion as reached by EMT's concerning Mikayla passing out from blood loss noting her hemoglobin levels were not beyond the limit needed to render her unconscious. He also provides that during his 30 years of experience women do not pass out during labor without a significant medical event taking place such as a pulmonary embolism. Dr. Cook didn't observe any evidence of any major medical event during his examination of Mikayla.

Dr. Sozio provided information learned during the autopsy to Dr. Cook that includes the results of a float test of the lungs (lungs placed in water to see if they contain air). During this test one of the lungs floated indicating the baby drew breath after being born and prior to death. Both Dr. Sozio and Dr. Cook agree that the baby was born alive. Utilizing results of the autopsy along with the information from the timeline and knowledge provided by Dr. Cook, Dr. Sozio established a cause of death as "Asphyxia due to drowning" and the manner of death as "Homicide."

Motive


In review of the aforementioned timeline several events indicate motive, to include Mikayla's effort to cause an abortion. This can be seen in text messages to Landon as well as internet searches that provide suggestions of how to cause an abortion with 'home remedies' (i.e. 02/13/16 internet search "At home abortions that work" - Google). On March 8th (day of incident) at approximately 5:42 a.m., Mikayla searches "4 Ways to Cut the Umbilical Cord of a Baby" - wikiHow, indicating an event occurred that makes Mikayla aware she is in labor. Thirty one additional internet pages are viewed throughout the following 17 hours and 27 minutes, all related to dealing with pain from being in labor and information regarding Mikayla's observations as she is giving birth. Between the 5:42 a.m. and 11:09 p.m. Mikayla never calls 911 for assistance or tells anyone she is in labor. We know from Dr. Cook the baby was born prior to 11:09 p.m., Mikayla then waits 19 minutes before dialing 911 at 11:28 p.m.

During Mikayla's interviews she does not account for the 19 minutes. She continues to lie about knowing she was pregnant and uses her supposed lack of knowledge as an excuse. She indicates when she awoke in the tub she observed the baby completely submerged underwater (not floating) which contradicts reports from EMT's and Dr. Cook's opinion that a newborn will float.

It is apparent Mikayla is using her false lack of knowledge and unconsciousness as an alibi to the truth. The truth being she knew she was pregnant and she killed her newborn baby by allowing him to drown in the bathtub.


